### **GSSA PRESIDENT**

Let me start this newsletter with the hope that 2024 will be a peaceful and prosperous year for all GSSA Members and Fellows. For the Society, 2024 will be a year to remember.

We will relocate the office from the Mandela Mining Precinct (see column from Craig Smith for more information), host the 36th Alex du Toit Memorial Lecture Series and celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the discovery of the Merensky Reef. In addition, we will offer a range of continuing education options, continue with the very successful SACNASP Candidate Mentoring Programme through the office of the VP Professional Affairs, strive to revitalize several of our Branches, launch new divisions and plan for events in 2025 including the Namaqualand Diamond Centenary (NDC) conference in March and Geocongress 2025 later in the year.

The 36th Alex du Toit Memorial Lecture Series will run from February 15th through to February 28th with campus-based lectures in Stellenbosch, Bloemfontein, Johannesburg, Durban and Mbombela (see flier elsewhere in this newsletter for details). In addition, to accommodate those members unable to reach any of the venues, the lecture at Wits on February 22nd will be recorded and uploaded to the GSSA YouTube Channel at the end of the lecture tour. The biennial Alex du Toit Memorial Lecture is organized by the Fellows Committee, but the hard work is done by the regional representatives and for this series of lectures I recognize and thank Tahnee Otto (SU), Matome Moitsi (UFS), Grant Bybee and Robyn Symons (Wits), Tanja Reinhardt (UKZN) and Xolane Mhlanga (UMP).

In terms of the By-laws of the GSSA, the Fellows Committee serves for 2 years after which it must be reconstituted. In keeping with this process, a new Fellows Committee has been selected for the period January 2024 to December 2025. Paul Nex has decided to step down from the committee and the Executive thanks Paul for his contributions over the last few years. Judith Kinnaird has stepped down as Chair but will remain on the committee at least for 2024. Andrew MacDonald and Bertus Smith are welcomed as new members of the committee and Louise Coney has been elected as the new Chair. As a result, Louise will serve on both Manco and Council. The role of the Fellows Committee is to oversee the evaluation of nominations received for the various awards and memorials of the GSSA and to make recommendations to Council on the recipients for these awards e.g., the Alex du Toit Memorial Lectureship, the Draper Award, the Des Pretorius Award, the Jubilee Medal, Student Awards, Honours Award, Honorary Membership and Life Membership.

Hans Merensky and his Lydenburg Platinum Syndicate discovered the first economic platinum deposit in South Africa, at the Mooihoek dunite pipe (Eastern Limb, Bushveld Complex) on 15th August 1924 (Roger Scoon pers. com.). To celebrate this important discovery and to honour Hans Merensky, the GSSA is organising The Merensky Reef Centenary Meeting combining a two-day scientific conference, with pre- and post-Conference field trips to the Eastern, Western and Northern limbs of the Complex and a pre-conference workshop. ### **EXECUTIVE MANAGER**



The GSSA is vacating its office in the CSIR Mandela Mining Precinct. We have enjoyed prime office space in the MMP since 2017, at no cost to the Society. The site boasted a small conference facility which we made good use of. There was ample storage space, as well as good security and accessibility. We thank the CSIR for the hospitality shown to the GSSA staff and visitors.

However, all good things come to an end, and the pandemic was the catalyst in this case. Most of the organizations resident in the MMP adopted remote working practices, including conferencing, and never reverted to pre-pandemic office usage. This is a very expensive site to maintain for the few staff present on any given day. The site has been sold, and the tenants must exit.

Post-pandemic, the GSSA staff also adopted remote working, with the office being manned for only two to three half days per week. It makes little sense to maintain expensive office premises for remote working, and even less sense to put all the furniture, library and other collections into storage when they may not be used for a very long time. The extensive rock collection will go to Wits, where it can be used and displayed. The library will also go to a university with a final decision being made by end month. The office furniture will be sold, and we have an offer in hand for all as one lot. Should any of our members wish to be considered, bids can be accepted until close of business on February 1. However, we will not sell item by item; it is all or nothing!

Some materials such as essential business records and some book stocks will be put into storage in Midrand. Meetings and events can be scheduled at any number of facilities anywhere in the country, and we have access to the Johannesburg Country Club. The GSSA will have a business address for legal purposes. Dispensing with a physical office is a bold step for the Society, but is not a giant leap. We have in fact been functioning remotely since the pandemic. The support and service we provide to the Membership will not change.

### **Consultants - Code of Ethics**

The GSSA is aware of complaints by individuals/companies on geoscientists with respect to fraudulent and unethical practices and would like to remind all geoscientists that:

- In order to practice as a consultant (either as an independent, an academic, or as part of a consulting company), you MUST be registered with SACNASP. Simply being a member of the GSSA in insufficient.
- In due recognition of the Code of Ethics of both the GSSA and SACNASP, consultants may only practice within the scope of their competency - you may not accept work for which you are not properly qualified.
- The Codes of Ethics also require that you do not take on more work than you or your company is able to handle at that time.
- The clauses dealing with ethics and honesty in dealings with clients and communities must be carefully considered in all your dealings.

# FIRST CIRCULAR AND CALL FOR PAPERS



### **FIELD TRIPS**



For all delegates contemplating joining the fieldtrip, please note that we will be visiting a number of operating diamond mines on which security is a significant part.

- On-mine (internal) security clearances will be required for Kleinzee, Alexkor and Namdeb – the relevant forms will need to be completed by the end of January 2025. These will be mailed in 04/2024.
- Namdeb is located in Namibia a valid passport will be required by all delegates. It is the delegate's responsibility to ensure that their travel documents are in order.
- The restricted areas permit (RAP) for entrance into the Namdeb onshore marine diamond mining operation will require a police clearance certificate, not older than one year.it is any potential delegate's responsibility to acquire this certificate timeously. Currently, in South Africa, such certificates can take 4-6 months, due to the backlog at the SAP. PLEASE APPLY FOR YOUR CERTIFICATE in good time – you will not be able to enter the minesite without it.






### **About DSI-NRF CIMERA**


