The third Diamond, Kimberlite and Alluvial Deposit Symposium & Trade Show will take place in Kimberley, South Africa in August 2023.

The international diamond market has showed improvement since the challenges of the past few years (particularly the Covid Pandemic), and new technologies are ensuring the regular recoveries of large exceptional quality diamonds and driving far reaching changes in every aspect of the business. There has also been a pick-up of Junior alluvial diamond mining in the area around Kimberley, and new screening and recovery technology is assisting the industry and ensuring regular recovery of some exceptional and large diamonds from alluvial deposits.

This symposium will focus on research and new technologies being applied across all facets of the industry, diamond exploration and mining, including alluvial diamonds. New findings relating to kimberlite exploration will also be presented. Technological developments relating to diamond processing, recoveries, and security, particularly of large high value diamonds and exceptional, which are key considerations in the mining and recovery process given the generally high value of the product, will also be addressed.World-wide activities of diamond explorers and miners, senior and Junior, will be covered, as will the state of play of the international diamond business.

Participants will get exposure to the fascinating history of the Northern Cape Diamond Fields. 2020 was the 150th anniversary of diamond mining in Kimberley which paved the way for the development of the modern diamond industry under the initial stewardship of De Beers, and subsequently other major players as well such as Alrosa, Argyle Diamonds, Debswana, Rio Tinto, BHP, Dominion and Petra.

The symposium will also acknowledge and pay respects to several pioneers of diamond and mantle mineral R&D, exploration and evaluation of deposits, and the mining of kimberlites and alluvial deposits, both land and marine.

SCIENCE AND CAREER EXPO IN LIMPOPO

We had a successful trip to Maleboho West and Bahananwa Science and Career Expo 2023 organised by Kodumela Bokamoso Youth Development. We were provided with a classroom that we tried to make visually appealing using UJ and GSSA banners, and photographs of mineral crystals at the classroom entrance. Throughout the day, groups of 35-60 learners visited different organizations in different classrooms, and in our classroom, we had 17 group visits. So, we reached 600-800 Grade 12 learners from 14 different schools. Training Scam



It has been brought to our attention that there are a number of Training Scams doing the rounds. These scams may appear to come from reputable professional conference organisers and advertise what look like really good, albeit very expensive, courses with reputable speakers. In some cases, the delegates arrive at the defined place to find that so such event exists, or that the advertised presenters are not featured and that the actual presenters are way below par. When people write/phone to complain, telephone numbers, emails and even bank accounts no longer exist and even the SAP are not able to assist.

Please note that all bona-fide GSSA events (and GSSA partner events) will be advertised in the Monday Mailers, in the monthly newsletters and on our website (Upcoming Events – GSSA and Partner Talks – GSSA). If you receive communication from third party organisations purporting to have the GSSA as a partner, please confirm with us at info@gssa.org.za before registering.

Given the current economic conditions globally, scams like this are likely to increase. It should become good practice for all to be wary of potential scams. Check with a colleague, check with listed presenters and inform us at the GSSA if you have been scammed – we wont be able to do anything about getting your money back, but we can build a database of organisations potentially involved in such scams (or which are being targeted by the scammers).
