In early October 2022, Minerals Council South Africa's Roger Baxter told the Joburg Indaba that "South Africa's geological prospectivity is fantastic." However, he then went on to say, "The people that find the deposits these days are the mathematicians and statisticians who sit in little offices looking at the geological abnormalities using algorithms to do so, and then send the geologists to go and find the deposit."

While it is true that the modern geoscientist needs to have more tools in their belt than 20 years ago, to suggest that mathematicians and statisticians will know what to look for and how to interpret "geological abnormalities" is simplistic at best. Without the knowledge base and practical experience that the geoscientist brings to the table, South Africa is never going to garner 5% of global exploration spend. This sort of comment only serves to deter young people from studying geology (and related fields) at university and exacerbates the situation of failing to grow the mining sector, which Baxter bemoans in the same article.

What we should rather be doing is to highlight the multitude of roles that geoscientists play in the whole exploration process; to emphasize the importance of traditional knowledge and skills as well as identify the competencies that will be required to contribute to the future of mining, both here at home and globally. These new skills are already being introduced in universities and through CPD programmes at Professional Bodies such as the GSSA.

South Africa has a proud history of geoscientists and mining engineers leading the charge in the global mining industry. The Minerals Council should be promoting the geosciences and its practitioners, without which the 5% target is certainly unachievable. Exploration is a team effort and needs appropriate skills, favourable regulatory environments, efficient government departments, access to land, and risk capital. Belittling the foundations of successful mining operations is not helpful.

We celebrate Woman's Day, but it is also important to celebrate the achievements of men.
